About the School :

Overview



Established in the year 1960, South Point School, Guwahati is a coeducational day-cum-boarding school. The School is affiliated to Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), New Delhi. The school provides liberal education on modern lines with stress on innovation to suit changing times and requirements. The foremost aim of the school is to train students to be honest, cooperative and disciplined.

With an infrastructure that supports excellence in all areas, South Point School provides a wide array of facilities to provide instruction and training in scholastic and co-scholastic areas.

The school is located on a 3-acre campus in the city of Guwahati — the capital of the State of Assam. As the gateway to the North East India, Guwahati combines a quaint old-world charm with the vibrant

environment of a modern city having a cosmopolitan culture. The campus is on a quiet street off Lokhra Road in the southern part of the city.

Our Mission

Our mission is to ensure that all children become achievers, to instill in them the desire to go the full course and give their best in everything that they do, and while doing so, make each school day special. Our motto is "Pursuit of Excellence" and we aim to provide the best possible environment for our children to excel.

Morals

The school sets a premium on moral well-being of its students. They are made aware of the 'dos and don'ts' in everyday interaction with others in school, at home and elsewhere. Students are told about social mores and customs they are expected to respect and abide by, through actual classroom activities as well as through skits and play-acting. Students are encouraged to differentiate between the right and the wrong and are taught to be infused with a sense of morality from early in life.

Discipline

Constant vigil is maintained to ensure discipline among students within the school premises and beyond at all times during school days. Students are expected to conduct themselves in appropriate and acceptable manner and to be aware that breach of discipline will surely invite disciplinary measures from the school authority. Corporal punishment is totally done away with, and the favoured correctional steps are fines and suspensions.

Scholastics

The school strives to maintain high academic standards in conformity with the policies and agenda of Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), New Delhi to which it is affiliated. Constant monitoring of the students' acquisition of knowledge and skills is effected through our association with Education Initiative (EI), Ahmedabad, a premier scholastic testing organization and the periodic conduct of Assessment of



Scholastic Skills through Educational Testing (ASSET) organized in house by El.

Selection of subjects of study and their courses at the primary level is as per the guidelines and design set down by the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT). Computer Science is taught as a compulsory subject from classes 4 to 8 and as an optional subject beyond. The school has two well-equipped computer laboratories for this purpose. English is taught as 1st Language. Students of classes 1 to 10 are given a choice of one 2nd Language from Assamese, Hindi and Bengali. Students of classes 6 to 8 studying Hindi or Assamese/Bengali as 2nd Language also study Assamese or Hindi as an additional 3rd Language. The subjects of study in the secondary and senior

secondary sections are as prescribed by CBSE, New Delhi. The school also has modern and well-equipped Physics, Chemistry, Biology and Geography laboratories to provide practical instructions to students.

Attendance

The school expects regularity of attendance from its students. Above 90% attendance during the academic session is the norm and the students are discouraged from taking day off for minor reasons. Students with 100% attendance during the session are awarded a special certificate and gifted a book during the Award Ceremony on the Annual Result Day.

Students and their parents/guardians are to note that although illness or other serious circumstances may be considered valid reasons for absence from school, avoidable and continued absence from school, failure to write the required number of assignments, unjustified absence from tests, tutorials, practical examinations, etc. seriously affect a student's academic record. If a student persistently continues not to conform to stated requirements, the school might refuse admission to the student into the next academic year.

Library

The school has three spacious and well-stocked libraries and reading rooms for Pre-Primary, Primary and Secondary/Senior Secondary school students. Students may borrow books from a wide range of story books, general interest books and reference books. A variety of newspapers, magazines, periodicals and journals, English and Vernacular, encyclopedia, and some other books are available for in-house reading. Two audio-visual rooms allow students to listen to and view educational materials, and participate in workshops and seminars.

House System

The school has a House system whereby all students are allotted a House each from four-Red, Blue, Green and Orange. Inter-House competitions are organized throughout the academic session. The house scoring the maximum points in scholastic and co-scholastic fields is awarded the Best House Trophy at the beginning of the subsequent school session at a Banner Presentation Ceremony in school.

School Days and Timings

The school has six days week (Monday - Saturday) for all classes and five days week (Monday - Friday) for Senior Secondary Section. 2nd & 4th Saturdays are holidays.

Counselling

The school provides counselling of students by its three full time qualified psychological counsellors. Parents and Guardians may also consult them about specific problems of their wards with prior appointment.

Sports (Optional for Class 6 and above)

Sporting activities are an integral part of daily routine of our school and are given due importance as a co-scholastic activity. Facilities for different sporting activities, both indoor and outdoor is provided along with qualified and trained coaches. Sporting activities in school are regulated and directed to



provide for scientific and systematic development of sporting skills among participating students. Mass drill and aerobics are taken up with middle school students as part of their physical training programme. Several sporting events are conducted through the academic session as part of Inter-House activities, culminating in an Annual Sports Day towards the end of the session.





Music and Dance (Optional for Class 6 and above)

The school provides training in music and dance, both Eastern and Western, as part of its coscholastic programmes. Instructors are engaged for the purpose and students are regularly assessed for progress made and sent up to perform on stage in school functions as well as participate in intra and inter school competitions.

Yoga (Optional for Class 6 and above)

The school has a spacious yoga hall with adequate facilities for the practice of yoga by students conducted by qualified and experienced yoga instructor. Yoga classes are compulsory for students of classes 3 to 5 and taken up as a co-scholastic activity for students of classes 6 to 10.





NCC (Compulsory for Classes 6 to 9)

The school has Boys and Girls NCC Units, both army, under the 1 Assam Battalion and 60 Assam Battalion NCC. Associated NCC Officers are in charge of the two units and the cadets undergo training in school on a regular basis, and also at Annual Training Camps held every year. Selected cadets participate in Republic Day Camp in New Delhi.

Students of classes 7 to 10 may enroll as cadet as part of their co-scholastic activity.

The school also has Scouts & Guides for upper primary and secondary school students and Cub & Bulbul compulsorily for lower primary school. Scout Masters and Guide Captains are engaged to impart training and conduct activities for scouts/guides and cubs/ bulbuls, which also involve training at camps during holidays and field trips during school days.

Art & Craft (Optional for Class 9 and above)

The school provides intensive and extensive training in Fine Art and Craft works to students having interest and aptitude in the same as part of their co-scholastic activity.

Qualified and experienced Art and Craft teachers are engaged full time to instruct the students on use of different mediums and methods in executing such work in a dedicated class room equipped with all necessary facilities. Periodic exhibitions and competitions are held to showcase and test the artistic skills developed thereby.

Medical Support

The School has contracted an NGO, 'Project Child' to provide all kinds of medical support to our students including First Aid, ambulance, qualified nurse, access to hospital on emergencies, health check up with record keeping, monitoring of school canteen etc.





Adventure Club

The School has an Adventure Club for conducting different adventure activities like Rock Climbing, Rapelling, Traverse, Trekking, Chain System River Crossing, etc. under expert guidance.

The School Adventure Society also sponsors students to undergo higher level of adventure courses like mountaineering in Darjeeling (W.B.), Ice-skiing course in Manali (HP).

School Magazine

The school magazine 'PINNACLE' is published every year around September/October containing selected writings by students along with class and activity photographs and scholastic and co-scholastic records of previous academic year.

Assessment and Evaluation

Scholastic and co-scholastic evaluation of students will be done as per guidelines laid down by CBSE, Delhi.

For classes 3 to 10

There are two terms in a session. The First Term will have Mid-Term Examination to be held before Puja Holidays, and the Second Term will have Annual Examination to be held at the end of the session. Periodic Tests will be held twice every month.

Annual assessment (100 marks) will consist of the following: Periodic Tests : 10 marks Note book submission: 5 marks Subject enrichment (project/ASL/Lab activities/Practical works etc): 5 marks Annual examination: 80 marks Students will also be assessed on their co-scholastic activities as also regularity of attendance, conduct, behaviour, punctuality, grooming etc.

All registered students of class 10 will appear in All India Secondary School Examination (AISSE) conducted by CBSE, Delhi after completion of Class 10 curriculum. A minimum of 75% attendance is mandatory for students to be eligible to appear in AISSE.

For classes 11 and 12

Students appear in two 100 marks examinations through the academic session, Half Yearly and Annual/Pre Board Examinations. Students are sent up for All India Senior School Certificate Examination (AISSCE) after completion of class 12 study. A minimum of 75% attendance is mandatory for students to be eligible to appear in AISSCE.

Parents-Teachers Meetings

One parents-teachers meeting is held in each term and another on the Result Days for Mid-Term / Half Yearly and Annual Examination of their wards and parents/guardians must compulsorily attend these meetings to interact with concerned class teachers and other teachers.

Boarding House

The Boarding House of South Point School provides accommodation along with board, tuition outside school hours, health care, sports facilities and leisure activities to the boarders of school. The boarders are accommodated in individual cubicles for senior students and dormitories with attendant for primary & upper primary students in the Boarding House halls located within the school campus in air conditioned halls. Qualified and experienced wardens, balsevaks and balsevikas are engaged to attend to all needs of the boarders. A medical doctor is on call to provide medical care to boarders in case of indispositions not requiring hospitalisation and for routine medical check-up. The Boarding House has arrangement with reputed city nursing homes for treatment with hospitalisation of boarders in case the need arises. The Boarding House also provides for physical training and co-scholastic activities. All scholastic and co-scholastic activities of the boarders are supervised and monitored by the School authorities to ensure satisfactory progress. The Boarding House has a modern and well-equipped kitchen with trained chef under supervision of qualified dietician preparing balanced and nutritious vegetarian and non-vegetarian snacks and meals served in a common well-lit and well-ventilated dining hall with hygienic and adequate seating arrangements. All washing and ironing of clothing of boarders are done in-house.

Holidays and Vacation

School remains closed on Independence Day and Republic Day and on some major festivals. Birth and death anniversaries of important national and religious figures are observed in school. School remains closed for summer vacation during the month of July/August for 30 days, from 25 December to 1 January as winter break and for two weeks after the end of the session. School Record Book and Academic Calendar for the session with holiday list, assessments and events schedule are provided at the time of admission/re-admission of students.

Boarders are required to vacate the boarding house during summer vacation, puja holidays, winter break and session-end holidays.

Conveyance

Conveyance for students is provided by the school against payment of quarterly charges payable for 4 quarters. School buses operate on fixed routes within greater Guwahati.

Other School Facilities

Canteen : The school has a canteen within its premises for beverages and light refreshment served in a hygienic environment for students and staff. However, parents/guardians are expected to provide nutritious snacks in tiffin boxes to their wards to be had during recess. Aerated soft drinks are not sold at the school canteen.

Drinking Water : The school has a custom-built purified drinking water plant with dispensing units that provides safe drinking water round the clock.

Balsevaks and Balsevikas : The school has male and female attendants to attend to the needs of the students and ensure their safety and security inside the school campus and on school buses while commuting, who are appointed after proper vetting.



Security : The two school gates are manned round the clock by security personnel and all activities inside the school premises are monitored on closed circuit television.

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Fee Refund Policy

A. Before scheduled commencement of session (first working day of school)

- 1. If admission is sought to be cancelled after having been taken, at any time before scheduled commencement of the session, 75% of the total fee paid may be returned, irrespective of which date admission had taken place.
- 2. No refund of fee is permitted once the academic session has started and admission is sought to be cancelled, irrespective of which date the admission had taken place.

B. After scheduled commencement of session (first working day of school)

- 1. If admission is sought to be cancelled after having been taken, at any time on or after scheduled commencement of session (first working day of school), then the following rules will be applicable :
- a) 75% of the total fee will be refunded if the admission is sought to be cancelled within 3 (three) days of taking the same.
- b) 60% of the total fee will be refunded if the admission is sought to be cancelled within 7 (seven) days of taking the same.
- c) 50% of the total fee will be refunded if the admission is sought to be cancelled within 15 (fifteen) days of taking the same.
- d) No refund of fee is permitted in case of cancellation of admission beyond 15 days of taking the same.


